Residency Style Model

With enough hours to emphasize relationships, planning and integration

PARTICIPANTS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 6-8th grade students at Madrona K-8 - Middle school teachers in the core curriculum (LA, SS, math & science) - One master level teaching artist with experience in school day collaborations with teachers and a strong lens in race & social justice
ACTIVITIES
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Teaching artist is placed at the school to do collaborative, arts integrated residencies. - Support for collaborative planning between teachers and teaching artists. - Support (time built in) for the TA to do work in community building, including performances and exhibits of student work
OUTPUTS
<p>All students (approx. 100) will get to work with the teaching artist 4 times throughout the school year, once in each subject, totaling 36 contact hours per student.</p> <p>Each middle school teacher will collaborate with the teaching artist once during the year.</p>
OUTCOMES
<p>Student skills and creative development</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - skills in the arts and in performance/exhibition - skills in creative thinking, collaboration and interpersonal relationships - academic mindsets and skills <p>Student engagement and motivation leading to success in life and school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - curriculum is relevant and meaningful - increases in attendance, grades and test scores <p>Middle school impact</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - increasing classroom capacity to meet all student needs/interests - alignment between classrooms with common learning goals and language

Description of Services

The teaching artist teaches **4 separate residencies** over the course of the year. Each residency lasts 3 weeks. Each middle school teacher will collaborate one time.

The teaching artist dedicates about **61 hours/residency (244 hours/year)** to the school. These hours are split between instruction, planning and other responsibilities including exhibiting artwork, community building and special projects. During a residency, teaching artists will spend approximately three days a week instructing at the school.

Timeframe

October will be dedicated to planning, determining the exact dates, and hiring for the TA position if needed. **Residencies will take place from November through June** tentatively beginning with Social Studies, since we have had the most experience integrating in that class, followed by Language Arts, Math and Science.

Planning support for teachers

We will provide **5 hours of paid planning time for each teacher**. This should include approximately 2 hours on the front end attended by an AC staff person, with another 3 hours of planning time to be scheduled as needed during the 3 week residency. These meetings will be scheduled as out of service time. Teachers will be paid for extra time by the school and Arts Corps will reimburse the school.
