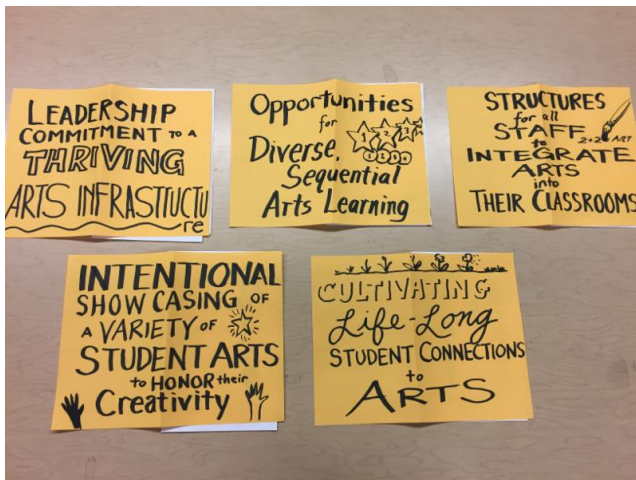

Arts Team Next Steps: Sharing the Arts Plan



Tips for introducing your arts plan to your school community

At a staff meeting or family / PTSA meeting...

- Distribute copies of your arts vision and action plan.
- Introduce the members of the arts team and discuss how the arts impacts your students and teachers' practice.

Lead the group through a brief arts activity. Then have staff debrief or reflect on the experience as a group so that the value of the activity becomes clear.

Ask people to become involved in the implementation.

Include one arts experience at every staff meeting. Or have a meeting that focuses on the arts at least three times a year.

In your school newsletter...

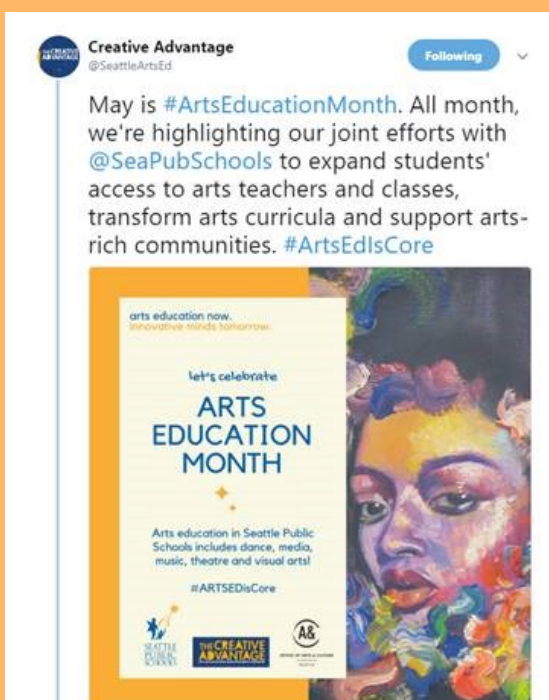
- Introduce the arts team and your arts goals for the year. Let people know how they can help. Include a survey link to find out about arts interests, skills, and invite people to get involved in growing the arts at your school.

Creative Advantage 2017 Progress Report

The Creative Advantage 2017 Progress Report has been published! We will deliver paper copies to your mailboxes this month, and you can see the attached e-version [here](#) and now.

Highlights include:

- A joint letter from **Mayor Durkan and Dr. Nyland** that celebrates the growth of students' access to high-quality visual and performing arts education over the last four years.
- A story about Nate, a Southwest Interagency **student who had his first music education experience as a senior**. It helped him engage in school and changed his own sense of agency.
- **Growth in the number of schools with K-5 music and visual art** programs across the district – nearly doubled from 2013 to 2017 (and they have doubled in 2018!)
- Evidence of Culturally-Responsive Teaching and Learning is 34% higher in Central Arts Pathway schools than the statewide average.

MoPOP is proud to support our region's educators by providing an educational space where artists, audiences, and ideas converge; fueled by the risk-taking and creative power of pop culture. **We are assembling an Educator Advisory Board to help us develop programs that meet the complex needs of modern classrooms.** This board would help us test new programming, receive exclusive workshops free-of-charge, and help shape our curricula moving forward.

Here are some of the benefits of being part of the board:

- Free admission to our Open House and Educator Happy Hour on June 15th.
- Free pilot workshops in your classroom.
- Free Educator Membership to the museum, which includes increased access to our exhibits, discounted fees for in-museum programs, and free participation in our professional development workshops.
- \$250 stipend.

Here are some of the requirements:

- Must be a classroom teacher in a K-12 school within King County.
- Teachers must be available for full-cohort meetings up to 4 times a year, around Sept, Nov, Feb, and May. Attendance is mandatory for participation. We will schedule the dates to be as flexible as possible.
