

**Pongo Poetry Workshop Theme:** Let's Face It

Length: 60-90 Minutes

Standards: CCSS:ELA:W.4; WA-ELP:9-12.7

## **Snapshot**

**Essential Question** (Why are we learning this?): What happens when we face our fears?

**Learning Target** (*What are we doing?*): Students read 1-2 examples of personal poems; students write their own poem (s) on the theme or other personal topic.

**Success Criteria** (*How do I know I was successful?*): I wrote 1 to 2 personal poems on the topic of Courage/Fear or other personal topic; students use 3-4 poetic devices to personize the poems.

Opening Poem—(2 minutes)

"The Lessons of Courage and Fear" by Keesha (Youth Poet)

**Intro to Personal Poetry Writing with Pongo** — (5 min)

Opening questions: Who's written poetry before? What makes a good poem?

Pongo Poetry Project's Values:

- Honesty is the most quality of good poetry.
- Write from the heart about who you are as a person.
- Young people have important things to say.
