Snapshot

Essential Question (*Why are we learning this?*): How does where we come from affect who we are?

Learning Target (*What are we doing?*): Students read 1-2 examples of personal poems; students write their own poem (s) on the theme or other personal topic.

Success Criteria (*How do I know I was successful?*): I wrote 1 to 2 personal poems on the topic of identity in relation to place or other personal topic; students use 3-4 poetic devices to personize the poems.

Intro to Personal Poetry Writing with Pongo – (5 min)

Opening questions: Who's written poetry before? What makes a good poem?
